

Options to Replace Missing Teeth after Extractions

Permanent Solutions (Non-Removable)

Option	Description
All-on-4	A full set of replacement teeth supported by four to six titanium implants . It is a permanent, non-removable solution for an entire upper or lower arch.
Single Dental Implant	A titanium post placed into the jawbone that acts as an artificial root for a single custom crown. It is the most stable and natural-feeling long-term option.
Fixed Dental Bridge	A restoration that "bridges" a gap by using adjacent natural teeth as anchors. It is permanently cemented in place and does not require surgery.

Removable Solutions

Option	Description
Snap-on Smile	A thin, removable appliance made of high-tech resin that snaps over your existing teeth . It's a non-invasive way to cover gaps, stains, or missing teeth without altering your natural structure.
Partial Denture	A removable set of teeth on a gum-colored base . It typically uses metal or plastic clasps to hook onto your remaining natural teeth for stability.
Dental Flipper	A lightweight, temporary acrylic partial denture. It is often used as a short-term "filler" while a permanent implant or bridge site is healing.
Full Dentures	A complete set of removable teeth for an entire arch. They are held in place by natural suction or specialized dental adhesives.
